Aging in a Changing Region (AiaCR)

The RRF Foundation for Aging has funded AiaCR from 2021 through 2023

AiaCR is a partnership between a regional agency & a small consultancy:

- Metropolitan Mayors Caucus
- Planning/Aging my consultancy focusing on the intersection of community planning & aging communities

Resident & Stakeholder engagement is a key element of AiaCR, and we conduct two Public Workshops in each community

The AiaCR program – provided at no cost to selected municipalities -- recommends specific strategies to help them elevate their support of Aging-in-Community





What does Aging-in-Community mean?

- Promotes whole-of-community/whole-of-government strategies
- Multi-sectoral involves physical, social & emotional environment actors
- Multi-age what benefits one community age group likely benefits most
- Consistent with a "Livable Community for All Ages" approach
- Broader than an "Aging-in-Place" lens
- Assertively takes an anti-ageist approach



What is Ageism & how does it link with DEI?

- Ageism is one more ism add it to the list with racism, sexism, ableism, etc.
- Ageism is discrimination against individuals or groups on the basis of their age
- Interpersonal ageism & Internalized ageism
- Ageism is one of the more insidious isms it is so engrained in society



What is Ageism & how does it link with DEI?

- Communities often practice ageism in ways that range from micro-aggressions to blatant
- Examples can include:
 - Not giving older adults agency or a voice
 - Considering older adults solely from a needs-based perspective
 - Focusing community discussions on other sectors (families, school children, etc.)
 - Marginalization of older residents
